Introduction

Following are the steps to create two different egg designs. How the other two eggs are decorated is up to you! Use the designed egg coloring sheets for ideas and the blank egg coloring sheets to create your own designs.



EGG 1—Step 1

Attach the bunny sticker to the egg. Make sure all the edges are sticking to the egg. You may have a couple of bumps or lumps in the middle of the sticker but that is okay.



EGG 1—Step 2

Place dots around the perimeter of the bunny sticker by tapping the tip of the marker on the egg. Continue adding dots to the egg around the bunny sticker. Add additional colors of dots with the different colored markers. Remove the bunny sticker when you are all done adding dots. The markers may bleed a little into the white space of the bunny. This can be touched up with white paint or left as is.











EGG 2—Step 1

Cut or punch shapes using the tissue paper provided. If using a punch, place the tissue paper on top of a piece of copy paper then punch. You can layer multiple pieces of tissue paper but make sure to use the copy paper also.





EGG 2—Step 2

Use watered down school glue to attach the tissue paper shapes to the egg. Add the watered down glue to the egg using a paint brush. Use the paint brush to pick up the pieces of tissue paper and add them to the egg. Allow one side of the egg to dry before turning over to add tissue paper shapes to the other side. If you don't allow the tissue paper to dry, they will stick to your fingers as you turn the egg in your hand.
