



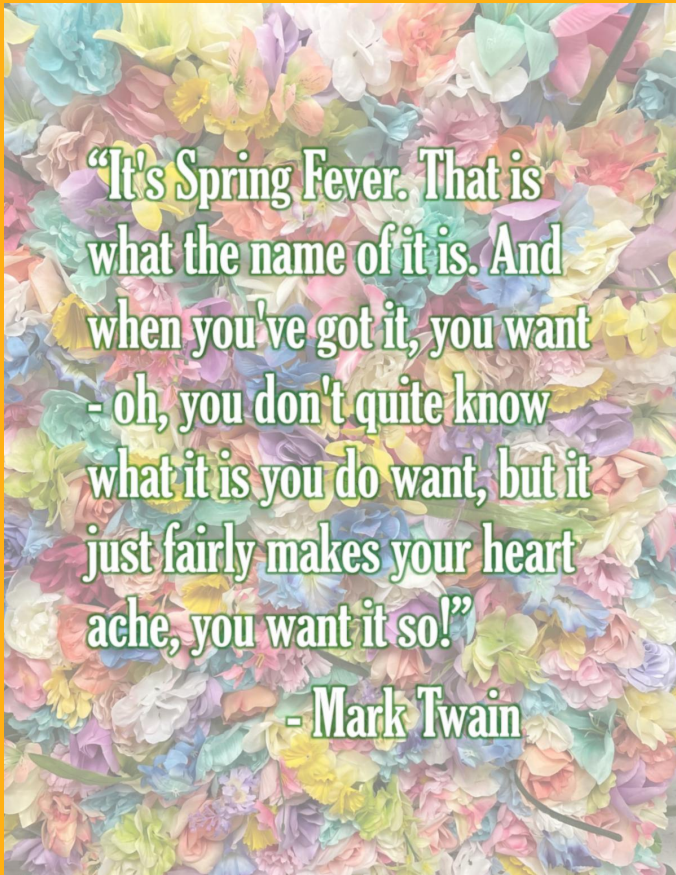

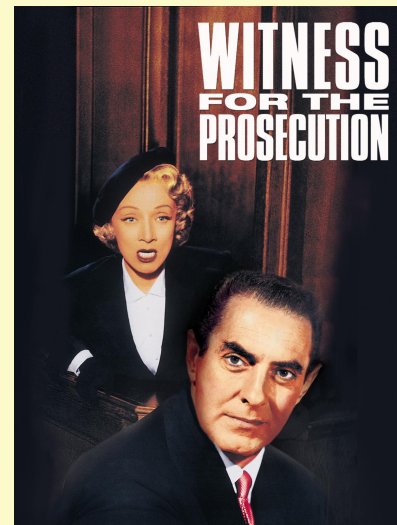

Topical Tuesdays: Constituent Communication with Elected Officials Tuesday, April 19 at 7 pm

Way Library and the League of Women Voters of the Perrysburg Area welcome Dr. Nicole Kalaf-Hughes, Associate Professor of Political Science at Bowling Green State University for a discussion of her research on constituent communication. Dr. Kalaf-Hughes' research interests lie at the intersection of American political institutions and representation, with

her work focusing on how institutional incentives affect the behavior of elected officials at the local and federal levels. Her recent projects explore the role of race, ethnicity, and gender in representation, collaboration, and policymaking in the U.S. Congress. Her research agenda also includes pedagogical work on student engagement, and she is the recipient of the American Political Science Association CQ Press Award for Teaching Innovation. Her work has appeared in journals including *Politics, Groups, and Identities*, *Journal of Public Policy*, *Policy Studies Journal*, *Politics & Gender*, and *the Journal of Political Science Education*. She received her Ph.D. from the University of California, Davis.

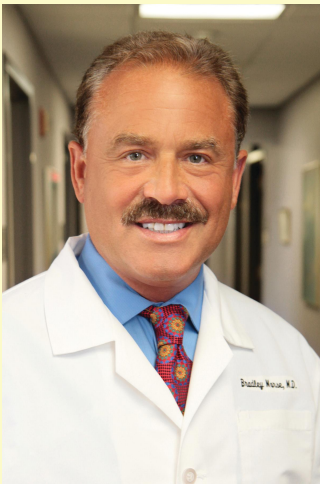

inspiring painters' dreams.

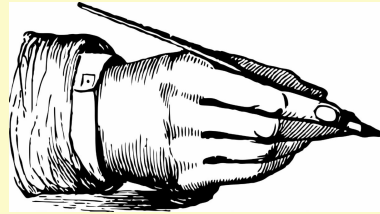

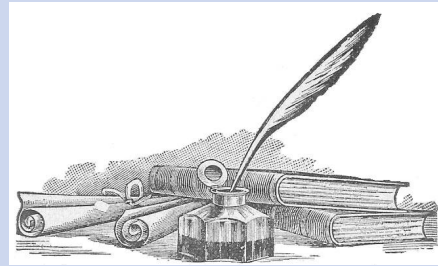

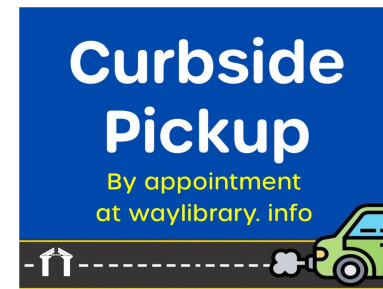
