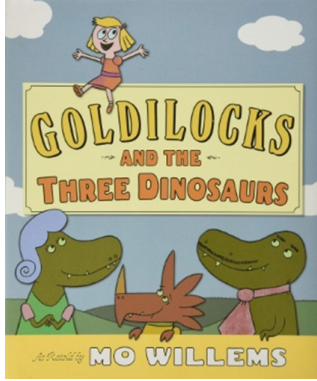


6th Biennial Veterans Exhibit Invitational at Way Library

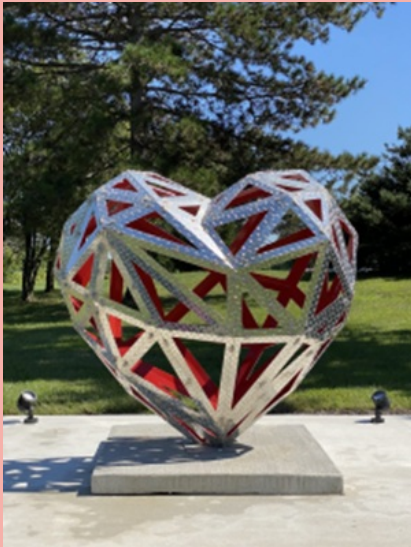

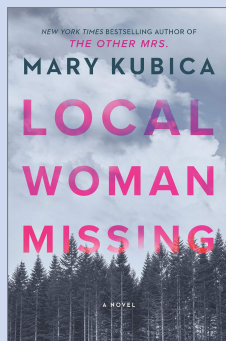

St. Luke's and Mercy Health - What's Next?

Mercy Health assumed ownership of the buildings and assets of the former McLaren St. Luke's Hospital on June 2, paving the way for continued health care excellence in the Maumee, Perrysburg, Waterville, and surrounding communities. In keeping with our commitment to engage community members on the future of health care in the region, Mercy Health has planned a series of Community Listening Sessions.

The sessions will focus on garnering input in three areas:

1. What health care access points are needed;
2. What community involvement should Mercy Health engage in;
3. Types of health care services needed in the area.

McLaren announced in early March the difficult decision to close St. Luke's Hospital and related outpatient services. Since this announcement, Mercy Health is pleased to have hired 410 McLaren St. Luke's employees; assumed the sponsorship of the McLaren St. Luke's physician residency program; and hired 22 WellCare Physician Group providers.

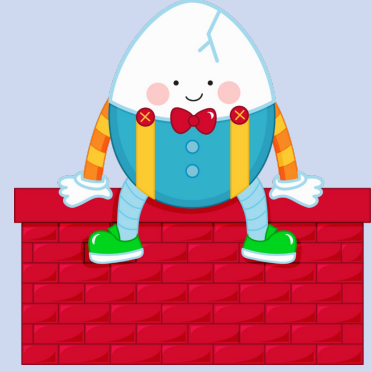
