

Blooms for Mother's Day Thursday, May 9 at 4 pm







Archeoastronomy Tuesday, May 14 at 7 pm

Thursday, May 16 at 2 pm








Show Me The Movie - *Corner Office* (PG-13) Tuesday, May 21 at 2 pm




Inspirational Book Club Wednesday, May 22 at Noon

Author Visit - Philip Eil Prescription for Pain Wednesday, May 22 from 6-8 pm






This true-crime book follows journalist Philip Eil's during his 12-year investigation into Paul Volkman, a promising doctor now serving four consecutive life sentences in a federal prison. Eil corresponded with and interviewed Volkman, the central figure in a massive "pill mill" scheme in southern Ohio. Volkman's pain clinics accepted only cash, employed armed guards, dispensed opioid painkillers, and remained in business for three years despite law enforcement raids and complaints from families of patients. Ultimately, prosecutors linked him to 13 overdose deaths of patients and explored his ties to at least 20 other deaths. In addition to interviewing Volkman, Eil traveled to 19 states to interview more than 150 people and filed a Freedom of Information Act lawsuit against the Drug Enforcement Administration that led to the release of nearly 20,000 pages of trial evidence. Philip Eil is an award-winning freelance journalist based in his hometown, Providence, Rhode Island.
