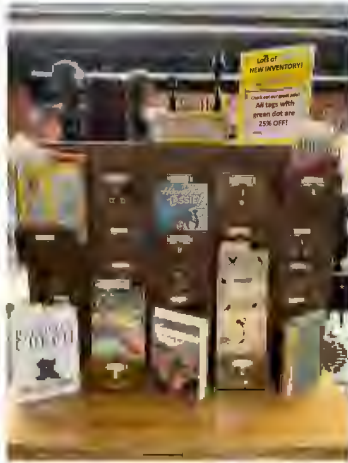
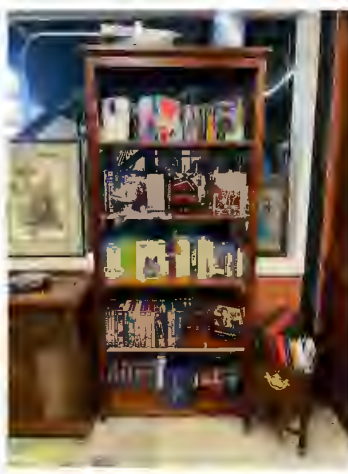

Terry Burton is the director of the Wood County Board of Elections. He began his career in elections in 1990 during college, helping on election nights by organizing ballots for counting. Terry joined the office full-time in 1994 coordinating office technology and recruiting precinct workers then named director in 1996. The 2024 General Election will be Terry's 8th Presidential election and 84th overall election administered. Terry graduated from Bowling Green State University and currently serves as 1st Vice Chair of the Ohio Association of Elections officials. Terry and his wife Julie live in Bowling Green and have one son.
