Historic Perrysburg and Way to partner for program on bungalows

Dr. Ted Ligibel, nationally known historic preservationist, has been invited to speak at the first commissioned lecture of Historic Perrysburg, Inc., this spring.

Mr. Ligibel's talk, including more than two dozen visual images, will focus on Perrysburg's extensive collection of Arts and Crafts bungalows. It will be held at 7 p.m. on Tuesday, April 11, at Way Public Library. The lecture is free and open to the public, and refreshments will be served.

Mr. Ligibel is presently the director of Eastern Michigan University's Historic Preservation Program, the largest preservation graduate program in the country. The author of four books on history and preservation, Mr. Ligibel has served as a guest lecturer at area universities. He established the historic preservation track at UT and developed curricula for UT and BGSU. He has

held leadership positions in the National Trust for Historic Preservation on state and national levels.

Mr. Ligibel will provide an overview of the Arts and Crafts bungalow, a significant architectural style popular in Toledo, Maumee, Rossford and Perrysburg. Way's LEAP program is selected as an 'exemplary project' by the State Library

The State Library of Ohio recently notified Way Library that its "LEAP" disability services program was selected as one of four exemplary projects for fiscal year 2005. The Institute of Museum and Library Services asks the State Library staff to choose 3-6 projects which most successfully further the goals of the Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA).

The LSTA was enacted in September 1996, enabling libraries to apply for federal library funds. Way received one of the 53 grants to Ohio libraries in 2005, allowing for the purchase of special technology to aid students and adults with vision problems or learning disabilities. Way librarian Deborah DiGennaro, project coordinator, partnered with the Perrysburg Schools and several area agencies to apply for and implement the grant.

Other exemplary projects were created by Dayton Metro Library, Cuyahoga County Public Library and Scioto County Joint Vocational School.
